### Coffee morning and plant sale.

On May 16<sup>th</sup> we held our Coffee Morning and Plant Sale in aid of our Junior Church project to send a cow to a needy family in Africa.

For weeks people had been making crafts to sell, collecting goods, making cakes and growing plants. Not to mention all the people working behind the scenes on the organisation and publicity for the event. On the Friday and Saturday a myriad of helpers were at church to set up the coffee morning and help on stalls. Our publicity also paid off as we had lots of visitors who came and supported the event. We are very grateful to everyone who helped in any way.

The event was a tremendous success financially and we raised a phenomenal £970. This was beyond our wildest dreams, and means that we can fund a cow out of this event alone (and still have some money left over!)

We are also very grateful to Denise and Brian Dilley for giving us a large donation to our project as a result of their asking for donations to Send a Cow, rather than gifts for their 40<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary.

Adding this money to our total takes it to over £2000! In fact as we go to press, the total stands at £2164. This is enough to send an entire farmyard of animals (one of each type), as well as the training and support to go with them.

We are very grateful for all your support so far but we're not stopping yet! The cow bucket will still be there on Sundays and

plants are still on sale at coffee hour. We hope to add a few more animals to our farmyard before we have finished.

On Sunday June 14<sup>th</sup> Jan Lowe from "Send a Cow" will be coming to tell us more about the charity's work and the families which they help. This will take place during the morning service at 10am. 
