View from the Churchwardens Pew!

Hello and welcome to the new **Churchwardens** slot in the magazine!

Each month we are going to try and let you know a little about what is going on behind the scenes, and by doing that, hopefully improve the communication within All Saints.

As you are aware there is the PCC (Parochial Church Council) elected at the Annual Meeting in April and this is responsible, together with the Vicar and Churchwardens for the running of the church.

What you may not know is that we have 5 sub-committees below that where the real work occurs. These look at worship and mission, events and outreach, finance, buildings and fabric and St Johns Hall and we thought you may like to know a little more about what is happening in these five areas and understand how All Saints ticks!

Each reports back to the PCC but sometimes information gets lost in the grand scheme of things so we hope to improve that a little here!

Worship and Pastoral Care (names still under review) look at the service patterns at All Saints. Long and hard debates were had over Matins versus the need to bring in younger families, and link those who do come to the Family service into the regular worship.

We feel this is a fundamental need as these people are the future of All Saints. Bible Study, Baptism and Wedding preparation link into this group as do Choir matters and service themes, and our major challenge and debate for the future is around children. How do we attract them to All Saints both through the choir and generally? If they want to sing – great, but if not sing what do we have to offer.....?

Events and Outreach does just that. The various social events of All Saints are organised through this group and we hope to be planning a year ahead – notoriously difficult for All Saints...!!! We are more of the "Last Minute. Com" variety as seen with the "Parish Jolly" – early on Sunday 17th we had 20 replies, by Tuesday we had 80! This does not assist planning at all and we really need to change!

We are working on a rolling Parish Calendar with all important dates published months in advance. We want to have events that will

bring in new people while nurturing our present members and build the family of All Saints as a welcoming and fun loving church committed to working with God.

Buildings and Fabric is just that – looking after our great building and working with the Town Council to look after the churchyard. By the time you read this the car park will have been resurfaced thanks to the excellent relationship we now have with Nina Villa, the Town Clerk and the Council.

Future projects include re vamping of the Vestry and a major project on renewing the lighting. However, all this costs money and we must mention Derek and his amazing team of ladies and gents who assist at the monthly work parties. This group saves All Saints an amazing amount of money and he is always looking for new recruits to join the team! This team also look after the cleaning rotas and the next big spring clean will be on March 6th – everybody welcome and there are jobs for all.

Finance is also just that and also looks at Stewardship. 2009 was an excellent year for All Saints and we made more money than anticipated, which is good news.

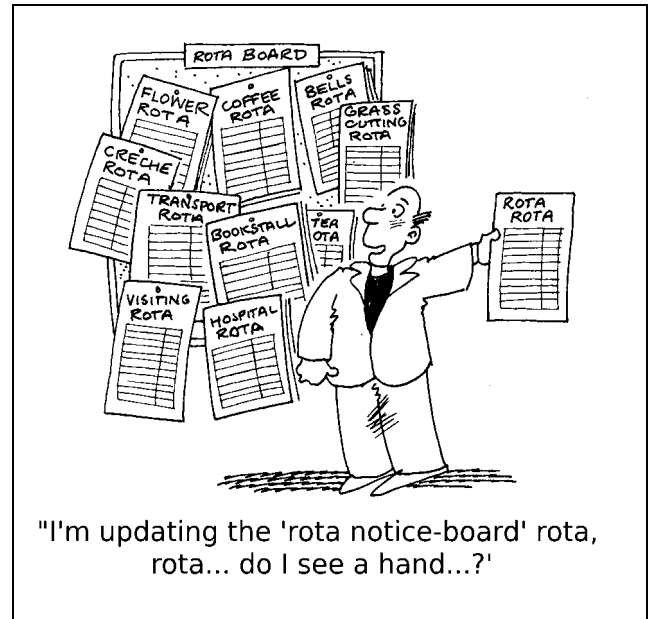
There are always things that swallow it up – we need to boost the fabric fund and the Organ fund to say nothing of the lighting project....

The St John's Hall Committee looks after the running and bookings for the hall which is financially independent and also provides some funds for All Saints. It is excellent outreach into the community and is a real asset for All Saints. However it does get booked up easily and therefore we must improve our planning to ensure that we are able to use the hall as we need to – we need to think ahead and plan the BBQ and Christmas Bazaar – Gone are the days of “All Saints Last Minute.com”!!
