This was the funniest joke at the Edinburgh festival last month. Tim Vine also won the prize in 2010 for his joke: “I’ve just been on a once-in-a- life time holiday. I tell you what, never again!”

In a society where we are so busy it is useful to have short pithy sentences which express a whole lot more. Many people are very experienced in this kind of writing by using Twitter, where only 140 characters can be used, and perhaps in texting where only 160 are allowed.

This has helped a lot of people become more succinct in their use of language and perhaps it means that we are all a bit more restless when it comes to people expressing themselves at length, perhaps in sermons and lectures?

For some time now our Diocese has also used a one liner: “Living God’s Love” as its mission statement. This vision is grounded in our love for God and our neighbour flowing from God’s love for us. The diocese then suggests our three priorities are:
