We hope this will encourage as many people as possible to take part; times and venues will be made known at the end of August and we will ask you to sign up for whichever suits you best.

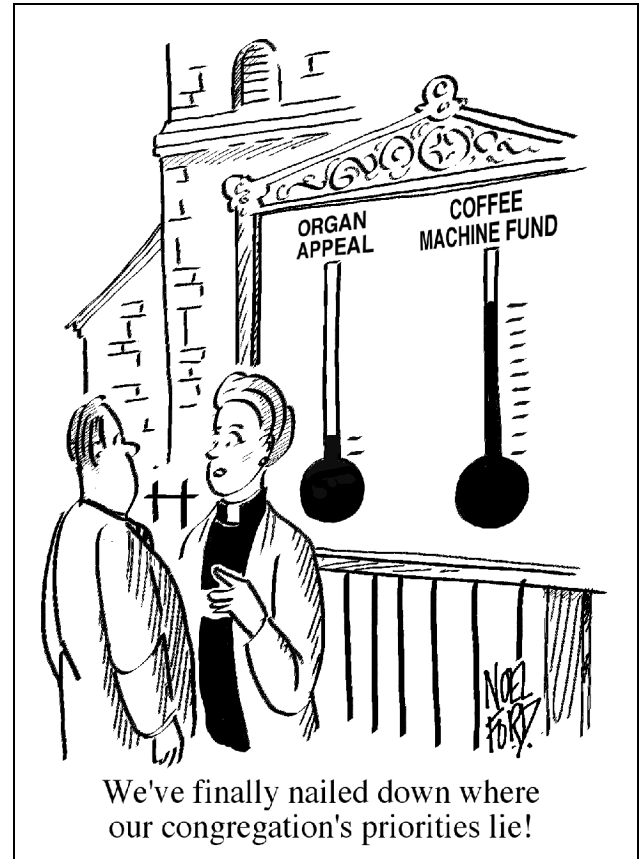
