## In Peace

24<sup>th</sup> January. Colin Alfred Lord was born on 4<sup>th</sup> July 1925 in Dursley Gloucestershire He had a happy childhood attending Dursley Secondary School, and passing the Oxford Local Schools Certificate before joining Lloyds Bank, Dursley in 1941.

He joined up on 25<sup>th</sup> September 1943 and served in the Royal Air Force. He trained as a Navigator in South Africa. Colin was discharged in September 1947 with the rank of Flying Officer, after completing service as Commanding Officer, Fourdon, Scotland, a bomb storage unit. (All the more senior officers had been demobbed before him and he had to call upon the experience of an older Flight Sergeant when airmen were brought to him for charges, much to his amusement.)

Colin rejoined Lloyds Bank in 1947, working at Wotton-under-Edge. In 1950 he became a member of the Chartered Institute of Bankers.

He met Jean, who was a Ward Sister at Scarborough Hospital, on a very wet walking holiday in Borrowdale in the Lake District in August 1954. Their courtship was long distance as Colin was living in Gloucestershire and Jean in Yorkshire. When he was appointed to Lloyds Bank Inspection Staff in Plymouth in 1955 they decided that if they wanted to see each

other the best thing to do was get married which they did in November 1955.

Their daughter Jane was born on October 4<sup>th</sup> 1957 and 1959 he was appointed Sub Manager Lloyds Bank, Stroud where their son Michael was born 12th November 1959.

In August 1962 he was appointed Manager of Lloyds Bank, Hertford. He quickly became involved in activities in the town and was Hon. Treasurer to many Clubs and Charities, notably Hertford District Scout Council for 25 years, and if not treasurer was likely to be Hon. Auditor! He was Hon. Auditor to All Saints Church for over 25 years.

Their son Richard was born in 1964. In 1969 he joined Hertford Rotary Club and served for many years as Treasurer and was President 1977/78.

His great interest was walking and was never happier than when he had on a pair of walking boots. He covered many miles in this country and abroad. He climbed most of the major mountains in Britain, walked across the Grand Canyon from the South to North Rim and up to the crater of the volcano Ruapehu in New Zealand.

He was able to indulge in another interest, sailing at Filey in Yorkshire where Jean's mother lived, and where many happy holidays were spent. Colin learned to sail with the Scouts and he then taught the rest of the family and much fun was had sailing in Filey Bay with 'Thumper' a Mirror Dinghy. He also ran a Badminton Club in St. John's Hall, and was very interested in photography.

After retirement in 1985 he added Bridge to his interests, spending many a happy hour playing with friends and at the age of 61 years took to skiing. This he enjoyed with much enthusiasm if not skill for 9 years until the onset of Parkinson's disease in

1995. In spite of this, Colin continued to live life to the best of his ability, he accepted his condition without complaint or bitterness. He loved his home, his children, and his eight grandchildren of whom he was very proud.
