

# Saint Nicholas

His full name is "Saint Nicolas, bishop van Myra." Saint Nicolas was born in Turkey in 270. He was born on 5<sup>th</sup> December and he died on the 6<sup>th</sup> of December.

Saint Nicolas lives in Spain. Each year he comes to the Netherlands and Belgium. In Holland and Belgium they call him Sinterklaas.

Children put their shoes out some where in the house and then Saint Nicolas comes at night and puts presents in them. Children get very excited!

He comes on a boat to Holland. All the children wave to him. He has helpers who are called zwarte pieten (black peter). Saint Nicolas wears a dress called a mantel, and a tall red crown (see picture). He carries a long gold staff.

When Saint Nicolas comes to Holland with his black peters he stays in a castle and he brings lots of presents with him.

On 5<sup>th</sup> December (*pakjes avond*) the black peters come and bang on all the doors of little children and they leave a bag with presents outside the front door.

In Belgium they celebrate on the 6<sup>th</sup>.

Saint Nicolas has a horse called Amirico. There is a television programme all about Saint Nicolas when he is in Holland and Belgium.

He arrives in his boat on the 14<sup>th</sup> November and he leaves on the 6<sup>th</sup> December. If children are naughty, they are put his bag and are taken back to Spain (this is what parents tell their children!).

In Holland we have chocolate letters and marzipan when Saint Nicolas is here.

Saint Nicolas has a book with all the children's names in there and whether they have been naughty or good.

Often Saint Nicolas visits junior schools. He takes his book with him to see if the children are allowed to have any presents. Older children make presents for each other called : "surprises".

There are many different Saint Nicolas songs like: *de zak van sinterklaas* and *sinterklaas kapoentje\** and lots of other songs.

Pepernoten are a biscuits that are very traditional at this time of year.
