

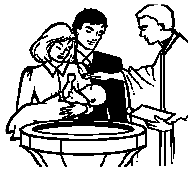

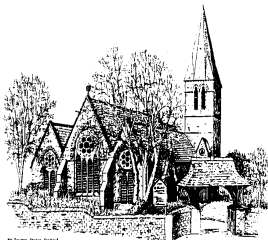

The 3 Peaks Challenge

Incorporating ascents of all 3 of the highest peaks in Scotland, England and Wales, the challenge covers a travelling distance of over 475 miles between the peaks with 3407 metres of ascents over 26 miles of mountain paths. All this and an attempt to complete the adventure in 24 hours or less! Used by fund raisers and dare devils alike, the "3 Peaks Challenge" constitutes the ultimate endurance mountaineering challenge in Britain and is a must for all climbers and walkers to have under their belt. Whether you take the challenge at its word and try your best to complete the distance in the 24 hours or just take your time and enjoy the views and the mountain air, the "3 Peaks Challenge" is an experience not to be missed. Coast to Coast Walk

Walk to raise funds for Isabel Hospice. Depending on skills this takes between 10 - 14 days. We have flexible dates in April. Originally planned in 1972 by the legendary Lake District walker Alfred Wainwright, the "Coast to Coast" walk is one of the greatest and most challenging prospects available in Britain to the walking community. At almost 200 miles in length and taking in the national parks of the North Yorkshire moors, Yorkshire dales and the Lake District, the

walk gives an ever changing and breath taking view of northern England. The walk starts from St Bees on the West coast of Cumbria, It then travels through Ennerdale and through the famous Honister Pass and over Shap and Sunbiggin Tarn. Following this you travel up to Nine Standards Rigg then out of Cumbria. The route then travels through the majestic Yorkshire Dales, and finishes by pushing across the the North York Moors, heading towards the finishing post at Robin Hood's Bay on the East Coast of North Yorkshire. All in all a daunting prospect but an amazing achievement. This experience can be broken down however you choose, creating either an adventurous and gruelling personal challenge for the likes of charity fund raisers or a leisurely, multi-day holiday for the enthusiastic walker.
