The Scheme relies entirely on the support of voluntary drivers using their own vehicles in their spare time. The client pays the driver directly, after the journey. Journeys can be arranged Monday to Sunday but weekend trips may be limited due to availability of volunteer drivers.

Trips can include health related appointments (no emergencies) such as:

- **Doctor/dentist appointments**
- **Hospital visits**
- **Outpatients**
- **Opticians**
- **Chiropodists**

as well as appointments for social purposes and everyday needs such as:

- **Visiting friends and relatives**
- **Church visits**
- **Shopping**
- **Day centres & clubs**
- **Outings**
- **Cultural activities (e.g. theatre etc.)**
