Once again this year we had a trusty band of people doing the Christian Aid walk and a larger wonderful group of people delivering and collecting envelopes during Christian Aid Week. A lot of hard work goes into making Christian Aid Week a success, and All Saints people once more did an amazing job.

The three walkers were humbled by the generosity of you all at All Saints. Many people sponsored all of us, and virtually everyone sponsored someone. Thanks to your generosity, the walkers raised a total of £703. This is about the same amount as we raised last year, and we can't thank you all enough.


