True Peace?




Dear Friends,

*Peace I leave with you;

Do not let your hearts be troubled,

What an amazing offer! But how do we really find that true peace?

If we stop right now and allow God to enter into our lives we can find the quiet peace of this present moment, without hurry, anxiety or the need to be elsewhere, but right here, right now, as we are, at rest.



Peace is also amazingly strong, the peace of forgiveness and the knowledge that God loves us for who we are, with no need to prove ourselves or even do better in this present moment. Peace can also be vibrant as we remember our oneness with all living things, and all of God's creation that peace of deep belonging and reconciliation with all people and all things.

Peace also allows us to heal and feel whole again even if we struggle and are in pain, as we know that in God ultimately all shall be well. Peace is experienced not so much on the outside where the world might judge but from within; and nothing can take this away.

Our services often start with a greeting of peace reminding us of the peace of God, setting the scene for our worship and enabling us to set aside the things and events that we may have been struggling with all week.

Then, in the middle of the Eucharist we have the Peace and we greet one another, wishing those we greet God's peace, helping us to overcome the issues we may have with difficult relationships with others and even with those we love.

At the end of each service we are sent out with the blessing which contains the words *the peace which passes all understanding keep your hearts and minds in the knowledge and love of God.*



As we continue to pray for the peace of the world, surely one of our duties as Christians to do, let us be mindful that we

can experience true peace in God's presence and then share this in our words and actions in our lives.
