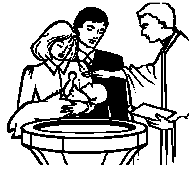

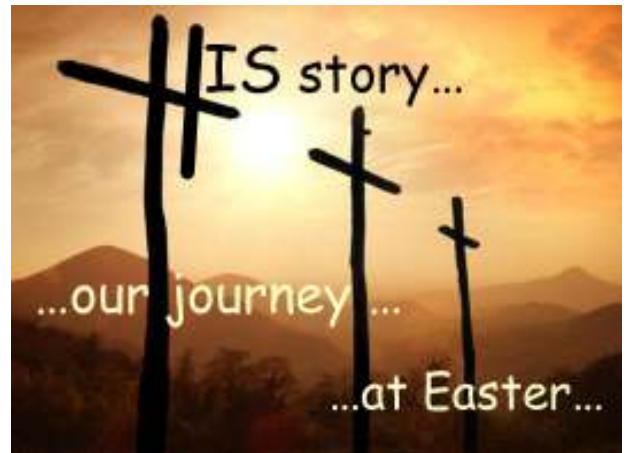

All Saints church will be open between **7pm and 8pm on Wednesday 2nd April** to provide a candlelit, reflective space for private prayer or quiet meditation. Everyone welcome, please come along and see and experience The Easter Journey for yourself.

The Christmas Tree Cross

A Cross made from our church Christmas Tree is in church through Lent and various items will be placed with it, reminding us of the lead up to Easter.

Ash Wednesday	Bread and Stones remind us of the Temptation of Jesus
Lent 2	A Purple Cloth symbolizes the robe Jesus wore
Lent 3	A Crown of Thorns tells of the pain Jesus suffered
Mothering Sunday	A Chalice and Paten, Bread and Wine and an open Bible remind us God is the mother of His family, the Church
Passion Sunday	Nails and a hammer tell of the brutal Reality of crucifixion
Palm Sunday	Palms greeted Jesus as he rode into Jerusalem
Maundy Thursday	A Towel and Bowl with which Jesus washed his disciples' feet
Good Friday	A bare cross with just a crown of thorns and cruel nails
Easter Sunday	The Cross will be covered in flowers representing the new life from the grave

Hertford Foodbank

On behalf of Hertford Foodbank I would like to thank everybody who donated gifts of food at our recent food drop at Waitrose on 14th and 15th March. Over 1200kgs of food was received during the two days. A special list was given out to shoppers which reflected the items which were most needed and Waitrose shelves were stripped of cereals, tins of fruit and potatoes and cartons of long life milk.

Currently the Foodbank is feeding between 40 and 60 people each week and the food collected at Waitrose will only provide enough stock for between 4

and 6 weeks. We are therefore equally indebted to all who donate food on a regular basis via the collection point at the back of the church.

We are always grateful to receive items of non-perishable staple foods, preferably with as long a shelf life as possible to ensure that we can keep the Foodbank fully stocked and ready to help all who are sent to us by the local referring agencies.
