You are all invited to join the PCC meeting on Tuesday 4th April in church at 8:00 pm.

We have now joined HeartEdge - the new network of churches formed under the auspices of St Martin-in-the-Fields.

Part of what we will be considering is the material we should send to the new network. This will enable us and them to consider how best we take advantage of the network's resources and experiences and move us towards the Kingdom model.

Now that we have joined, we have agreed to give the network:-

- Information about our story and journey as a church - what is working well and what isn't.
- Time to meet other member churches to share in the network.

- Ideas, stories, experience, knowledge, relationships, strategies and resources that can be shared with others.

As a start, we are asked to produce a snapshot of our church, so we and the HeartEdge team can consider how best to prioritise the resources. We will consider the following questions:-

- Our experience developing cultural, community or commercial activity
- The assets we have (we did some preliminary work on this at the launch)
- The obstacles and challenges we face
- The resources we need
- Our hopes and fears

We hope this will help us move forward in our efforts to create a sustainable future for All Saints.



Celebrating a special relationship – Parents and God parents



Godparents' Sunday is an innovation that sets apart a Sunday to celebrate and pray for the special relationship families have with Godparents.

It is a response to research undertaken on behalf of the Archbishops' Council looking at parents' real experiences and expectations around the baptism of their child.

One of the biggest findings of the research was that godparents really, really matter to families. Godparents are part of family life for all the years ahead, a relationship that will last into adulthood and beyond.

In 2017, Godparents' Sunday will take place on **30th April** with resources made available to help create a great day of welcome and celebration, but you can celebrate the role of godparents at any time of year if you wish.

Setting apart a Sunday is a great opportunity to share with families and ask for God's blessing on godparents and their godchildren everywhere.

Prayer

Brother Roger of Taizé once said 'When the Church becomes a house of prayer, the people will come' I feel strongly that God is asking us as a church to make prayer a priority and out of this will come clarity about how we move forward into growth. Any future activity should be born out of prayer. We are therefore planning four days of teaching on prayer called 'A House of Prayer'.

Beginning on Monday 22nd May at 8pm in St Andrew's the four days will culminate in our Team Ascension Day service on Thursday 25th. During these times we will explore different ways of praying from our rich Christian tradition and hear testimonies from different people from different walks of life about how they pray.

Our hope is that these evenings will inspire us and take something of the guilt or drudgery out of praying. Prayer is the oxygen of the Church, without it we die. I would therefore encourage everyone in the congregation in the strongest possible terms to make this a priority.

During these evenings, we will be thinking about four areas in which we as a church can make a difference in the world - healing/wholeness, justice, reconciliation and beauty.
