

St Paul's Church, St Albans will be hosting an exhibition that brings the Bible to life for people of all ages. The free 'Bible comes to life' exhibition will be at the church over the weekend of Friday February 1st to Monday February 4th.

It features interactive and multi-sensory displays, with large models, fascinating artefacts and talks delivered by experts in Biblical costumes.

Prominent will be a three-metre by two-metre model of the Temple in Jerusalem at the time of Jesus, complete with smoking altar!

Other exhibits include a large-scale model of the desert tabernacle where worship took place during the Jewish people's wanderings after their exodus from Egypt.
