

At the beginning of this crisis we were suddenly thrown into a very steep learning curve as we began to conduct our services via Zoom and Live streaming. After lots of trial and error, and a few glitches, the response has been overwhelmingly positive. Some of us are, understandably, beginning to ask when it might be possible to safely return to our church buildings for worship, and the simple answer is that we don't really know.

What we do know is that it will be gradual. Government guidelines suggest that places of worship will be included in the third phase of opening at the beginning of July, but it remains to be seen how possible and how practical this would be, given social distancing and the many new measures we would have to implement.

We will be looking at this carefully over the next couple of weeks and will keep in touch about how we will open our Church.

You may know that churches may be able to open for private prayer, and details are given below. Julia and I would be there to meet and greet people.

We look forward to the day when we can safely meet face-to-face, but for the time being we will look at how we may continue to worship together, reaching a larger number of people, so please can I encourage you to invite friends and family to join us if they would like to. Church open for Private Prayer

Following the recent change in Government policy, the church will be open for individual private prayer on Thursday 25th June from 10am to 12 noon and Sunday 28th June from 2pm to 4pm.

If successful, we aim to continue the same pattern each week until we are able to resume public worship. Measures are in place to minimise risk of COVID-19 transmission but if you decide to visit you do so at your own risk. Please observe the following rules to reduce danger to yourself and others:

1. Use the hand sanitiser provided on arrival and departure.
2. Keep 2m from other visitors.
3. Follow the instructions of the stewards.
4. Avoid touching furniture and other surfaces as far as possible.
5. If you can, avoid using the toilet.

We are looking for more people to steward the church.
