

Growing in faith

After Vespers (evening prayer) each evening in church, I try to read a section of the Rule of St Benedict and some commentary on that section by Joan Chittister OSB. Her commentary on a recent section took my breath away,

'...The spiritual life is not a set of exercises appended to complete reordering of our values and our priorities and our lives. Spirituality is not just a matter of joining the closest religious community or parish committee or faith-sharing group. Spirituality is that depth of soul that changes our lives and focuses our efforts and leads us to see the world differently than we ever did before...'



This is the essence of what Benedict hoped and dreamed of when he wrote his rule. Living the Way of Jesus is just that - it is about living Church, therefore, isn't about a place we come to on a certain day at a certain time, but a community we become as we seek


to live out what Jesus teaches.

As I enter my second year of ministry at All Saints, this is my hope for us. We will become a community of people who seek to live out what Jesus teaches in our daily lives. We will then gather to meet Jesus in our worship and be sent out to live it. Our church community will become what Benedict calls, 'a school of the Lord's service.' One that seeks to listen

and learn from Jesus, and then, as His apprentices, lives that out.

To enable us to do that we are launching a new vision for All Saints! On Sunday 21st September you are invited to join us for a special service to celebrate the Feast of St Matthew and to hear about it. This vision will take a few years to outwork together. The hoped outcomes of this vision will be that we become a community of confident and renewed faith in God; a place to which the wider parish looks for support community; and people who are sent out to serve the neighbourhoods around us as Jesus calls us to.

I hope you will make a special effort to be in



church on <u>21st September at 10am</u> and then stay after the worship for tea, coffee and cake, where there will be the opportunity to ask questions and hear more detail about what this means for us.

Plans to outwork that vision are already underway with the opportunity to learn together.




Zoom Lectio Divina group. Beginning on 8th September at 7.30pm we launch a weekly zoom Lectio Divina group. Lectio Divina (literally spiritual reading) is a way of prayerfully reading a passage of scripture and listening to what God may be revealing to us through it. We will meet for about an hour. Paper sign-up sheets are in church - fill one in and hand it to Rev'd. Simon.



The Prayer Course. This is an 8 week journey through the Lord's Prayer. It is an opportunity to learn about prayer and different styles of prayer. The course will run on Thursday mornings in All Saints from 9.15am-10.45am on Thursday mornings beginning on 2nd October. To get the most out of this course we would really like you to commit to all 8 sessions if at all possible. We would like to run this is an evening too. If you would value that or would be willing to host, please contact Rev'd Simon directly. Booking details will be available shortly.

<u>Small Saints.</u> This new group for preschool aged children and their parents/carers begins on 9th September from 10-11.30am. We are really looking forward to starting this group! Church Heating

We are finally able to start the work to replace our church heating boilers, which have been unreliable and inefficient (and expensive!) for the last few years.

The work is in three phases. The first two consist of the decommissioning of the current boilers and the removal/making safe of the asbestos in the boiler room and the adjoining storeroom. We expect the permission of the Archdeacon for this work, which is scheduled to start on 10th September and be concluded by the end of the month.

The third phase, the installation of new condensing boilers is dependent on the Diocesan Registrar issuing formal permission (the faculty) but, with the support of the Diocesan Advisory Committee, we hope to receive this in time for the installation before winter.

Bike 'n Hike is the main annual fundraising event for Beds & Herts Historic Churches Trust. By taking part bikers and hikers, who ask people to sponsor them, raise essential funds to repair churches and chapels which are important places for local communities. Each church involved keeps half of the funds raised by its supporters, while the remainder plus gift aid goes to the Trust to be awarded as grants to help maintain these historic buildings. Martin Bird and Kate Glover will be participating to raise as much as they can for the Trust and for All Saints'. There are 36 churches listed in the Hertford area, and

more if they take in Hoddesdon and Knebworth.

Participants can call in to have their forms signed any time between 9:00 and 5:00. During this period, our church will be open, and tea and coffee and light lunches will be served. There will also be a Coffee Morning, Cake Sale and Produce Stall which will run from 10:00 to 1:00. Fiona's Produce Stall will be in aid of the flood victims in Pakistan.

For those wishing to enjoy an aerial view of Hertford, the church tower will be open from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. If you plan to climb the tower, please take into account that the steps are uneven and there is no handrail.


Bishop's Harvest Appeal 2025

Rewrite Their Future

This year's appeal is called Rewrite Their Future, and we are once again partnering with Mission Direct. Their work in Uganda and Zambia is focused on building schools and improving access to education in some of world's the most under-resourced communities. After one year, these schools supported by Mission Direct will serve over 2,945 children, of which 1,170 will be benefitting from new classrooms —and over the next 20 years, 23,400 children will gain access to education that would otherwise be out of reach.

At a time when 250 million children globally are not in school, this is one small but vital way we can help change that reality.

Thanks to the generosity of supporters over the last 20 years, Mission Direct have been able to build 49 schools. Nearly all of these are still open and have grown substantially.

News from Sweden

Dear friends in All Saints'

Thank you so much for letting us visit you in June. We had a fantastic pilgrimage! We felt exceptionally welcome in All Saints', and it was pure joy to celebrate mass and baptism together! Truly a memory for life for all of us.



After the generous and delicious lunch (our thanks to all involved!), our pilgrimage

continued to Walsingham, and we had a good time there as well. The confirmands had the opportunity to be servers and acolytes etc. and carried the image of Our Lady in the evening procession.



On June 29 they were confirmed in Kärna. In the church of Sweden, it's not the bishop who confirms, but the parish priest.

This year is the 17th centenary of the Nicene Creed, and also the centenary of the big ecumenical conference in Stockholm in 1925 when Swedish archbishop Natan Söderblom invited all Christian denominations to a conference on God's Peace. Taking place just a few years after the Great War, that conference was a big success and became an important starting point of much of the ecumenical movement durina 20th century, not least between the church of Sweden and the church of England. Of which we are particularly glad... After the summer holidays some of our young adults spent a weekend in Stockholm on a big ecumenical meeting celebrating this together.

This autumn is election time in the church of Sweden. Every fourth year we elect our PCCs, our diocesan synod and our General synod. This is a very political affair, although we are no longer a State Church. It takes time and money, and personally I hope that soon the system will be simplified, but for now it's

almost like the General Election for parliament.

A more local event in Kärna is the centenary celebration of our church choir! We will have a jubilee concert and festivities on the 12th of October (Swedish Thanksgiving/Harvest festival).



Please keep us in your prayers, and if you would like, please pray for

- the next year of confirmands that they will have a good opportunity to deepen their faith and relation to the parish;
- the church elections for good people on all these important posts;
- the choir jubilee that it may continue to bring the joy of the gospel in our parish and in our society
