Growing the future

'... Autumn days when the grass is jewelled And the silk inside a chestnut shell. Jetplanes meeting in the air to be refuelled. All these things I love so well

So I mustn't forget No, I mustn't forget. To say a great big Thank You I mustn't forget...'

I wonder how many of you reading this remember singing that when you were at primary school? For me, it captures something of chilly October mornings and it is heavily laced with nostalgia for a bygone world. Jetplanes no longer need to meet mid-air to get refuelled for example. But 'assembly bangers' like this (as a friend of mine calls them) for many adults still carry memories of our school days but also carry residual Christian faith amongst a few generations of adults.

Over this Autumn I will have been into our local schools frequently, leading assemblies (yes they still happen and yes they are still broadly Christian) and supporting staff in other key ways.

Our schools still take values that shape our lives individually and corporately really seriously. In recent weeks I have led assemblies on the themes of community and kindness. In both cases we have thought deeply about how we live and learn alongside one another; what enables communities to thrive; and to acknowledge that communities flourish when we give back to others and support those in greatest need.

Our schools still take RE seriously. I've spoken with RE leads in two of our schools about the support I and we as a church, can give to ensure that the RE that students receive in the

classroom helps them to appreciate that our society isn't secular (with no religion present) but pluralist (a mix of faith traditions and none) which we need to learn about and learn from if we are going to continue to build strong communities across neighbourhoods; nations and our world.

Supporting our schools is vital to the work of the church in our community. For me personally, that work runs through me like the words run through a stick of rock. It is ministry of the highest order and worth and stuff I get enormous pleasure from. If you doubt that, please remember that I have had the chance to address hundreds of children and young people in recent weeks.

We are still trusted partners, to provide pastoral support when crisis or tragedy hits. We are still seen as purveyors and holders of values that make our society a community; and where the breadth of religious tradition is still seen as key to our life as a nation, we are seen as experts in our field.

When I go into a local school I go at their invitation. I assume no religious literacy. I will go, committed to speak about what it means to live out a shared vision of our common humanity how we want to live with each other on the local and global stage. And I will do all of that in a dog collar. I will speak, using the language of love that faith in Jesus gives us when invited to. And in so doing, I hope to offer a snapshot of the important part that faith communities play across modern Britain and a reminder that faith is an option for pupils and students alike and a transformative presence in the world today.

Please pray for our schools - their pupils, teachers, support staff, governors and families - that they would remain communities where pupils love to learn but also learn to love.


