There are posters on the church notice board and in St John's Hall giving details of who to contact should a safeguarding problem arise. There are also posters giving details of ChildLine.

CCPAS (Churches' Child Protection and Advisory Service) is the agency we, and the diocese have used for DBS checking. The organisation changed its name recently to reflect that Safeguarding also concerns adults who may be at risk. They are now known as **ThirtyOne:Eight**. This is taken from Proverbs chapter 31 verse 8, "Speak out for those who cannot speak".

All Disclosure and Barring checks are carried out very securely online. The applications are usually processed quickly, in one recent case a positive result was sent back the same day. A paper certificate is issued to the successful applicant which is valid for five years.

St Albans Diocese provides safeguarding training for anyone needing it. The Diocesan Safeguarding Officers are always available for advice, or if a serious situation arises within a church setting. I have been asked by the Safeguarding Administrator to remind those that need to complete C1 training that this can be completed on line. If you need the link I can forward it to you. In addition C2 training will be offered on line for those who need to update or who need to and haven't completed this yet. I raised this at a PCC meeting before lockdown. I will again forward details of the link
